

Route 1 In this course, you can enjoy the landscape of moat, Chidori-ga-fuchi thoroughly.

Circle Route around Chidori-ga-fuchi & Kitanomaru.

Length: 2.6km Times: approx. 50 minutes

Kudanshita Sta. → Chidori-ga-fuchi Greenway → Daikancho-dori Ave. → Kitanomaru Garden → Tayasu-mon Gate → Kudanshita Sta. **GOAL**

Chidori-ga-fuchi Greenway

This greenway is about 700m long along Chidori-ga-fuchi moat, located at the west side of the Imperial Palace. And it is one of the most famous cherry blossom viewing spots in Japan.



There are around 140 cherry trees such as Someiyoshino, Oshimazakura that welcome you as you walk through a tunnel of cherry blossoms. During the full bloom season, more than one million people come from all over the world.

Kitanomaru Garden

This garden is one of the best spots for cherry blossom viewing in Tokyo, where many cherry trees were planted in the 1960's. This includes around 330 Someiyoshinos planted in the park, where you can enjoy nature, such as the pond and fields. The view from the path along the Chidori-ga-fuchi moat is amazing. The cherry trees along with Tabunokis or Mizukis can be seen from a higher position, where their branches in full blossom are extended to the surface of the moat. The landscape full of gorgeous cherry blossoms is breathtaking.

Chidori-ga-fuchi Boat Pier

During the cherry blossom festival, business hours are extended. By boat, you can enjoy cherry blossoms illuminated at night along the moat.

Taking the environment into consideration, LED is utilized for lighting-up. This is not only eco-friendly, but also beneficial for the cherry trees. During the cherry blossom season, light-up time is from sunset to 22:00.

Length: 1.9km Times: approx. 35 minutes

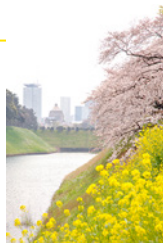

British Embassy Tokyo

The cherry trees in front of British Embassy were planted by the diplomat, Ernest Satow in 1898. People used to be able to enjoy the view of Mt. Fuji, Tokyo Bay and these cherry trees from here.

Chidori-ga-fuchi Park

Chidori-ga-fuchi Park is located between the British Embassy and the Hanzo-bori Moat at the west side of the Imperial Palace. There are nearly 130 cherry trees (such as Someiyoshino, Yamazakura and so on). You can enjoy the landscape of cherry blossoms and Nahananas (rape blossoms) near the moat, forming a remarkable contrast of pink and yellow.



The cherry trees in front of British Embassy were planted by the diplomat, Ernest Satow in 1898. They are worth watching.
